BAKED ROAST BEEF & PROVOLONE SLIDERS : From the Kitchen of Jan Cera

1 ½ sticks (12 T) butter, melted, plus additional for buttering baking dish

- 1 T Poppy Seeds
- 1 T Sesame Seeds
- ³/₄ t dried minced Garlic
- 1/2 T dried minced Onion

Kosher Salt

- 1 pckg Hawaiian Sweet Rolls
- 1 ¹/₂ lb shaved rare Roast Beef from the Deli Counter (preferably Boar's Head)

I used Steak Sandwich meat from Schwan's and fried sliced Onion with it, so I did not include the French-fried Onion Rings

- 2 C crispy French-fried Onion Rings
- 1 lb sliced Provolone Cheese
- 1 C Pickle Rounds

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Butter the bottom of a 13 x 9 inch baking pan.

Stir together the melted butter, poppy seeds, sesame seeds, dried garlic, dried onion and 1 t salt.

Without separating into individual rolls, slice the top half of the bread off the bottom. Place the bottom portion of the rolls in the prepared baking dish. Layer meat on top, then the crispy onions, then a layer of Provolone, then top with pickles. Place the top section of the rolls on top. Stir the spiced butter and then liberally brush over the tops of the rolls until entirely coated.
