# The **STATE DELEGATE** shall:

- Represent the chapter as the voting delegate at all district and state meetings or appoint a delegate.
- Share and update state and district information to the local chapter.
- See that news articles concerning the local chapter are submitted to the Newslet for publication.
- Distribute the Chapter Information Packet (CIP) to the programming vice president within one week of the state meeting.
- Make lodging reservations, transportation arrangements, and mail registrations in for the conventions.
- Be responsible for collecting registration fees from members who attend any out of chapter meetings.
- Arrange chapter visitations.
- Submit a trimester state delegate report to the Minnesota Women of Today.
- Shall promote attendance of the general membership at all district, area, state and national and visitations to other chapters.
- Prepare monthly participation reports, giving copies to the president and sharing with the Board of Directors for purposes of voting.
- Prepare a trimester report to report on chapter events, new member adds, socials, membership events and upcoming events to share at the district meeting.

# A. The **PROGRAMMING VICE PRESIDENT** shall:

- Act as an advisor and coordinator for the external and internal local program managers.
- Be responsible for reading and distributing materials from the Chapter Information packet.
- Ensure all external projects have a written report form completed.
- Have monthly communication with her/his program managers.
- Present trimester LPM awards and Outstanding LPM of the Year award.
- Ensure new local program managers receive adequate training in their position.
- Encourage LPM participation in her/his programming area
- Oversee two craft show committee chair meetings, one meeting prior to November craft show and one meeting post craft show by December 10

# **Local Programming Manager Positions**

# **Crescent Cove Priority Area (open)**

Program to encourage involvement with Crescent Cove. Crescent Cove offers care and support to children and young adults with a short-ened life-expectancy, and to their families who love them. Around the United States, there are over 4,700 hospice homes for adults; the Crescent Cove Respite & Hospice Home for Kids is Minnesota's first and only home designed just for children and their unique needs, and just the third of its kind in the United States. A vibrant and joyful home-away-from home, our goal is to help families feel Embraced, Assured, and Celebrated. 2021-2022 will be the first year for the MNWT three (3) year priority area.

# **Community Connections (open)**

Program to encourage involvement in their local community, (e.g. food shelf, a civic project, senior citizens, adopt-a-family, etc.) Promotes Friendship Ventures, the Outstanding Person with Developmental Challenges Award, Community Connection Awards, and national programming areas that do not fall under a MNWT programming area.

# Women's Wellness (open)

Educate members on current health issues; support a foundation dealing with women's health; promote the March of Dimes March for Babies.

# Youth of Today (Sherri)

Promotes ideas and activities that allow youth to discover and experience the importance of volunteering. Also promotes the OYA program, Kids Week, and foundations related to youth activities.

# **Living and Learning (open)**

Promotes participation and provides information and ideas in the areas of personal growth of members; intellectually, spiritually, civically, and through family. Also promotes the Effective Writing, Speaking, and Impromptu competitions as well as the Women Who Impact Awards. Oversee invocations and benedictions at meetings.

# **Newslet (Kris)**

Responsible for gathering the information for the monthly newsletter, putting it all together in an easy-to- read format, copying and distributing to members and other individuals.

# Public Relations (Julie, Abbi—looking for help!)

This area gets the word out about our organization. This position submits press releases to local newspapers and helps to identify other PR tools for the chapter, cable TV, radio, internet etc. Also promotes Women of Today week.

# **Records and Recognition (Bobbi)**

Program to encourage good recordkeeping for chapter projects; project recognition; mid-year and year-end entries; Projects of the Trimester; and Success.
